Entries: The Standard Race Entry Blank should be in the hands of the Race Committee by February 19, 1982 with a \$7.50 entry fee. Late registration the morning of race will be \$10.00. of the race at The Rudder Club.

Registration: a. Pre-Registration by mail

b. N.F.C.C. Feb. 18, 1982 meeting at F.Y.C.

c. Late registration 1000 to 1030 Hours at The Rudder

Club February 21, 1982

Skippers Meeting: 1045 Hours at The Rudder Club

Start: 1200 Hours. The starting line will be between a staff displaying a race committee flag on the committee boat

at the starboard end and the port end starting marker. Every effort will be made to have a windward start, with separate starts for one design classes. Starting sequence will be announced at Skippers Meeting. Yachts whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area and of all yachts whose warning

signal has been made.

Course: The course will be announced at the Skipper's Meeting.

All classes will race the same course.

Shortening Course: The race committee, after the starting signal, may shorten the course by finishing the race at any rounding

mark. Shortened course will be signalled by displaying from the committee boat code flag "S" which means "Finish

between the nearby mark and the committee boat".

Finish: The finish will be located in the area of the start. The finish line will be between a mark and a staff on the

committee boat displaying the race committee flag.

Individual Recall: Will be signalled by displaying code flag "X" with one horn. The race committee will attempt to hail the

sail numbers of the yachts concerned.

General Recall: Will be signalled by displaying code flag "First Substitue" with multiple blasts of the horn. After a general recall has been signealled, a new preparatory signal will be made one minute after the lowering of

code flag "First Substitute" with one cannon.

Eligibility: All yachts racing in P.H.R.F. classes are required to

have a valid certificate issued by U.S. PHRF of N.E.

Florida.

Classes: The PHRF fleet will be broken into Spinnaker and non-

Spinnaker classes. Expected one design classes are

Catalina 22, J-24, and Tartan 10.

Management: The race will be under the management of the North Florida

Cruising Club. It is the responsibility of the owner and the master of each yacht to see that his vessel is seaworthy in hull, rig and gear and the responsibility for accident or injury to any vessel or crew suffered in any

way from any cause during or related to the race.

Racing Rules: This race will be governed by the current Racing Rules of

the International Yacht Racing Union as adopted by the

U.S. Yacht Racing Union.

Penalties: The 720° turns penalty as provided in rule 74.5 and

appendix 3. Alternative Penalties for infringement of

a rule of Part IV, of the yacht racing rules shall

apply for infringement of a rule of Part IV.

Protests: All protests must be presented in writing following

the race. Notice of protest must also be given immediately after finishing by a HAIL acknowledged

by the Race Committee.

Results and Trophy Presentation: Results will be mailed to all entrants when tabulated. Trophies will be presented at the North

Florida Cruising Club meeting on March 17, 1982.
