# **Notice of Race**

# **1 RULES**

The race will be governed by *The Racing Rules* of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of the US SAILING; the rules of participating classes; the PHRF rules of the First Coast Sailing Association; (except as any of the foregoing are altered by these Sailing Instructions); and by these Sailing Instructions.

# 2 ADVERTISING

Advertising will be restricted to Category A.

## **3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

**3.1** The regatta is open to all boats of all classes.

3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and submitting it electronically or printing it and submitting it by facilime or in person at the time of registration. The registration form is also avilable at http://go-sailing.home.comcast.net
3.3 Anticipated classes are PHRF Spinnaker, PHRFCruiser, PHRF Non-Spinnaker, Portsmouth Monohull, Portsmouth MultiHull and Flying Scot. To constitute a class there must be three or more boats. Additional classes of three or more boats will be accommodated.

#### **6 VENUE**

The racing area will be in the St. Johns River between the Buckman Bridge to the south and the Fuller Warren Bridge to the north as depicted on NOAA Chart 11492.

#### **7 THE COURSES**

The courses to be sailed will be a windward/leeward.

## **8 TIME LIMIT**

The time limit shall be 3 hours for each class. Yachts failing to finish within 45 minutes corrected time after the first yacht of their class finishes will be scored "Did not Finish."

## 9 SAFETY

**9.1** All competitors are required to conform with the U.S. Coast Guard regulations and the RRS concerning personal floatation devices and other required equipment. All yachts are reminded that under fundamental rule 4 "A boat is solely responsible for deciding whether or not to start or to continue racing."

**9.2** Yachts shall not impede the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within a narrow channel, or commercial fishing vessels while fishing or vessels with restricted ability to maneuver. Racing yachts interfering with other vessels may be subject to protest by the Race Committee or contestants and possible disqualification.
