NOTICE OF RACE AND SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

FALL RIVER RACE

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 30, 2010



St. Johns River beginning in the vicinity of Fleming Island Marina

1.0 RULES

The race will be governed in order of precedence by this Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions; the rules of the First Coast Sailing Association (FCSA); and The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2009-2012 (RRS).

2.0 MANAGEMENT

This race will be managed by the North Florida Cruising Club, which is also the organizing authority.

3.0 ELIGIBILITY

3.1 The race is open to all yachts with a valid PHRF certificate from the First Coast Sailing Association (FCSA - <u>www.sailjax.com</u>).

The NFCC Club Handicapper is Jeff Knoll (jeff.knoll@st-barts.com).

Yachts that do not have a current PHRF rating assigned by the FCSA may obtain a provisional new rating (\$35.00 first-time annual fee) that will be submitted to FCSA for formal review.

3.2 A yacht participating in the Spinnaker or Non-Spinnaker Class shall have her sail number on the mainsails, spinnakers, and all headsails with an LP exceeding 130% of J.

A yacht sailing in the Cruiser Class shall have an identifying sail number on her mainsail.

4.0 REGISTRATION and ENTRY FEE

4.1 The standard FCSA race entry form must be completed in full and filed with the Race Committee before the Competitors Meeting.

4.2 Participants are encouraged to register in advance by sending the completed form with the appropriate fee to: Tom Bell, NFCC Race Captain, 3701 Race Track Road, Jacksonville, FL 32259. Registration may also be completed on the day of the race at the covered picnic tables at Fleming Island Marina.

4.3 The entry fee is \$25.00 for NFCC Members, and \$30.00 for non-members (\$25.00 if U.S. Sailing Member). Checks should be made payable to North Florida Cruising Club.

5.0 CLASSES

The fleet will be divided into three classes: Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker, and Cruiser. Classes may be further divided into Divisions if the number of entries permit. A multihull class may also be created with at least three registrants.

6.0 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Race day registration, Competitors Meeting, and post race activities will be held October 30, 2010 at Fleming Island Marina at the covered picnic tables. Fleming's office telephone is: 904-264-9100

Registration: Race Committee arrival till 11:45 AM

Competitors Meeting: 11:50 AM Warning signal for first start: 12:55 AM

7.0 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

7.1 Notices to competitors and changes to this Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions will be posted before the Competitors Meeting on a white board at the covered picnic tables at Fleming Island Marina.

7.2 The course will be announced at the Competitors Meeting and over VHF channel 68 as soon as the race committee boat is on station at the start.

8.0 THE START and FINISH

8.1 The start line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a pin-end buoy or government ATON.

8.2 Yachts shall check in with the race committee prior to the warning signal of the first class by sailing past the stern of the race committee boat on starboard tack and hailing her sail number. Yachts failing to check in may be scored DNS.

8.3 The race will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with the warning signal given five minutes before the starting signal. The warning signal for each succeeding class will be made at least 5 minutes after the starting signal of the preceding class.

8.4 The warning/class flag for the Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker classes will be Gold. The warning/class flag for the Cruiser class will be Pink.

8.5 Yachts whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid interfering with yachts preparing to start.

8.6 The preparatory flag for all classes with be the "P" flag.

8.7 Individual and general recalls will be in accordance with RRS 29. In addition, the race committee will attempt to announce over VHF channel 68 the sail numbers of premature starters. If a general recall is signaled, the order of starts will not change; all subsequent starts will be delayed correspondingly.

8.8 Yachts failing to cross the starting line within 30 minutes of their start signal will be scored DNS.

8.10 If a postponement is signaled by display of the "AP" flag, the warning signal for races not yet started will be made not more than 5 minutes after "AP" is lowered.

8.9 The finish line will be between an orange flag on the race committee boat and a pin-end buoy or government ATON.

8.10 The race committee will attempt to set the finish line at approximately the same location as the start, unless the course is shortened or changed due to weather conditions.

9.0 PENALTIES

The two-turns penalty will apply in accordance with RRS 44. Any yacht which exonerates herself from a minor foul in this manner shall notify the Race Committee of such action after finishing.

10.0 PROTESTS

All protests shall be submitted in writing to the Race Committee after the race no later than 10 minutes following a horn signal made upon arrival of the Race Committee boat at the dock. Notice of protest must also be given immediately after finishing by hail, and acknowledged by the Race Committee.

11.0 TROPHIES

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards will be presented in Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker, and Cruiser classes.

12.0 POST-RACE

Results will be announced AND AWARDS PRESENTED after the race at the covered picnic tables at Fleming Island Marina. The results will later be posted on the NFCC website <u>www.nfccsail.com</u> and the FCSA website <u>www.sailjax.com</u>. Race results will also be announced at the NFCC General Meeting, Thursday, November 18th, 7:30 PM at the New Orleans Café on San Jose Blvd at Julington Creek.
