## Update on SARW 2020

St Augustine Race Week 2020 is now scheduled for August 15-22, 2020. Sorry about the delay, but the procedure and protocols surrounding the virus contagion had to be dealt with. With proper planning and reworked planning, we are preparing for a great late summer event.

The current schedule is:

- Youth Racing August 15-16
- Dragon Boat Races August 17
- In-shore Racing August 18-19
- Offshore Racing August 20-22

A full schedule of On-shore events (at City Marina and/or St Augustine Yacht Club) is expected with the protocols of social distancing, etc. We expect each skipper to establish their on-board and at-the-dock protocols. With everyone's cooperation, we want Skippers, crew, and guests to be safe and secure.

We can report that the John D Meehan Youth Scholarship Fund will be supporting local youth sailing with financial assistance this summer. Thank you for assisting in this effort.

We understand that this new August schedule must be evaluated by each skipper and crew. To that end, we can make the following considerations:
