1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 Eligibly and Entry

- 2.1 Racing will be one-design competition in SAYC 420s.
- 2.2 Skippers must be SAYC members (crew need not be). Skippers must be experienced and proficient in sailing 420s, and have proper SAYC check-out approval. SAYC RCoS reserves the right to disqualify any competitor for unsafe boat handling.

3 Fees

3.1 Entry Fee will be \$35.00 inclusive of tax per series, or \$85.00 for the season (spring, summer/fall), payment must be received prior to racing. SAYC Members may charge their house account.

4 Schedule

4.1 Warning signal will be at 17:25 each day with exceptions noted for October races. One race per day is scheduled.

6 Venue & Courses

- 6.1 Racing will be in Salt Run, Saint Augustine, FL.
- 6.2 Course will be at the discretion of the Race Committee.

7 Penalty System

7.1 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

8 Scoring

- 8.1 One design scoring as defined in RRS Appendix A.
- 8.2 Each boat will drop their worst race provided that 4 races have been sailed in each regatta.

9 Radio Communication

9.1 Radio Communication devices of any kind are prohibited.

10 Prizes

10.1 Prizes will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd for skipper and crew (skipper for Lasers) at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021.

11 Disclaimer of Liability

11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12 Liability & Responsibility

- 12.1 Skippers are responsible and financially liable for any damage. Responsibility for collision damage between boats will be solely assigned by the Protest Committee.
- 12.2 Skipper's and crew are responsible for rigging, launching and retrieving their assigned boat.

1 RULES

- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

2 Notices to Competitors

2.1 Notice to competitors will be posted on the office event website:

3 Changes to Sailing Instructions

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4 Signals made Ashore

- 4.1 No signals will be made ashore.
- 4.2 If any race is to be cancelled
 - 4.2.1 It will be so indicated on the event website
 - 4.2.2 It will be announced as cancelled via email to participants

5 Schedule of Races

5.1 Schedule

First warning signal will be at 17:25 each day for the first start except for October 13/27.

5.2 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least five minutes before a warning signal is made.

6 Classes

6.1 One Design Class

- 7.1 Racing will be in Salt Run in the vicinity of the Conch House.
- 7.2 Courses will be defined by Race Committee on day of race.
- 7.3 Gate will be open unless specified by Race Committee.

8 The Start

8.1 Three minute dinghy starts

9 Penalty System

9.1 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

10 Time Limits

10.1 For all classes the time limit will be 30 minutes.

11 Protests and Requests for Redress

- 11.1 Protest forms are available at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 11.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 11.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held at the Saint Augustine Yacht Club as soon as practical thereafter.

12 Scoring

- 12.1 High Point Scoring will be used
- 12.2 Boats in the starting area will be counted at the discretion of the race committee.
- 12.3 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series

13 Safety Regulations

13.1 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

14 Radio Communication

14.1 Except in an emergency, or to comply with above instructions, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

15 Prizes

- 15.1 Daily results will be announced following racing at the SAYC.
- 15.2 Series prizes will be presented at the SAYC Awards Banquet on 11/14/2021.

16 Liability & Responsibility

- 16.1 Skippers are responsible and financially liable for any damage. Responsibility for collision damage between boats will be solely assigned by the Protest Committee.
- 16.2 Skipper's and crew are responsible for rigging, launching and retrieving their assigned boat.
