ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY:

4.1 The regatta is open to all PHRF boats, holding a PHRF rating certificates issued by the First Coast Sailing Association and boats of the Flying Scot, Thistle, "A" Boat, Hobie 16, Hobie 18, and Portsmouth classes. PHRF classes will consist of Spinnaker, Non- Spinnaker and Cruiser.

3.2 Additional classes of three or more boats will be accommodated.

3.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing a registration form, that will be send to the competitors attach to the sailing instruction.

1 Rules

1.1 The regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

1.2 The rules of participating classes and the rules of the First Coast Sailing Association for PHRF classes will apply.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Official notices to competitors will be posted on the notice board located on the north exterior wall of the Rudder Club and it will be communicated by radio.

3 CHANGES IN THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change in the Sailing Instructions will be announced at the skippers meeting. Registrants should attend via VHF channel 72.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The regatta is open to all PHRF boats, holding a PHRF rating certificates issued by the First Coast Sailing Association and boats of the Flying Scot, Thistle, "A" Boat, Hobie 16, Hobie 18, and Portsmouth classes. PHRF classes will consist of Spinnaker, Non- Spinnaker and Cruiser.

5 SCHEDULE

5. April 10, 2021 - All classes

5.1 Two races are planned for the PHRF Boats as well as the J24 fleet.

5.4 Competitors' meeting: 10:30 am via VHF in Channel 72.

5.5 Warning signal for first class: 11:30

5.6. Post regatta festivities will be held approximately 90 min after racing is concluded. A BBQ will be held at the Rudder Club of Jacksonville. Fee for lunch is \$10 per person. Please bring exact change.

5.7 Parking will be available at the outside of the rudder club.

6 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

6.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the north side of the Rudder Club.

6.2 Code Flag "AP", Answering Pennant, displayed ashore with two sound signals (one when lowered) means "The race is postponed" The warning signal will be made not less than 60 minutes after "AP" is lowered.

7 CLASS FLAGS

7.1 Class flags will be the International Numeral Pennants as depicted under Race Signals in the RRS. Class flag for the pursuit race is the Juliette signal flag. The class flag for Hobie race will be the Hobie class flag.

8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

8.1 The Sailing Instructions will be posted to the Fleet 55 Facebook page, distributed by North Florida Cruising Club and by the Rudder Club of Jax.

9. COURSE

9.1 The racing area will be on the St. Johns River between the Buckman Bridge as the southern boundary to a line extending from the northern point of NAS JAX to Epping Forrest Yacht club as the northern boundary.

9.2 Around the buoy courses will be as depicted on addendum "A" showing the approximate angles between legs, the order of rounding, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

9.3 The course for each class will be displayed on a white board located aft on non-course side of the committee boat.

9.4 If the Race Committee sets a gate instead of the Leeward Mark, boats shall sail between marks forming the gate from the direction of the last mark and round either the port mark leaving it to port or the starboard mark leaving it to starboard.

9.5 If the Race Committee sets an offset mark in the vicinity of the windward mark, boats shall sail around both marks leaving them on the prescribed side.

9.6 Marks 1 will be orange tetrahedron. Mark 2 and 2a will be an a yellow tetrahedron. The start mark will for an orange tetrahedron. Finish mark for the pursuit course will be an orange ball. Finish mark for the Hobie course will be a yellow ball.

10 START

10.1 The Starting Line will be a line between an orange flag flown on the Race Committee/Signal Boat and a mark set toward the left side of the course from the Committee Boat relative to the first leg of the course.

10.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.

10.3 (For the Hobbie, Nacra fleet) A boat crossing the start line, as if to start, later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored "Did Not Start." This changes RRS A4.

10.4 For the Monohull class there will be a pursued start, the race committee will be giving the times for each competitor via PHF, and before the event the race committee will be giving each boat a + time from the starting time. So, every boat should be able to know at what time they will be starting.

11. CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

11.1 To change the position of the next mark, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position. The change will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the mark may not yet be in the new position. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the moved mark may be relocated without further signaling to maintain the course configuration.

12 TIME LIMIT

12.1 The time limit for the first boat in each one design, round-the-buoy class to finish is 90 minutes from her start. The time limit for the first boat in each Portsmouth, PHRF, Hobbies, round the-buoy, class to finish is 60 minutes corrected time from her start. One design boats failing to finish within 30 minutes time of the first boat in their class will be scored Did Not Finish. Portsmouth and PHRF boats failing.

13 SCORING

13.1 Places will be determined based on order of finish.

13.2 The Low Point Scoring System of appendix A will apply.

13.3 One race must be completed to constitute a series. A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Protests shall be written on forms available at the Rudder Club. Protest time will end 90 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day. Protests will be heard in the approximate order received.

14.2 Protest notices will be posted on the electronic and physical Official Bulletin Boards within 30 minutes following the protest time limit.

15 SAFETY

15.1 On the first race of the day, boats shall attempt to check in with the Race Committee by sailing past the committee boat on the non-course side prior to their class Warning Signal.

15.2 Boats withdrawing from a race prior to finishing a race or retiring before racing has ended for the day shall make every effort to ensure that Race Committee is notified that they have dropped out

15.3 All competitors are required to conform to the U.S. Coast Guard regulations and the RRS concerning personal floatation devices and other required equipment.

15.4 Boats shall not impede the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within a narrow channel, and give way to commercial fishing vessels while fishing or vessels with restricted ability to maneuver.

15.5 In accordance with RRS 42.3(i), providing no significant advantage is gained, a boat may employ propulsion using an engine or other method to remain clear of or not impede the passage of a vessel restricted in its ability to maneuver when required by the Inland Rules.

16. SUPPORT BOATS

16.1 Support boats will display a red and yellow flag similar in design to code flag uniform

17. ADVERTISING

17.1 If the boat has advertisement either in the hull or in the sail, they will still be permitted.

18. College sailing rule

18.1. Every boat in the event should have at least one local college sailor on board. A list of volunteers will be provided.

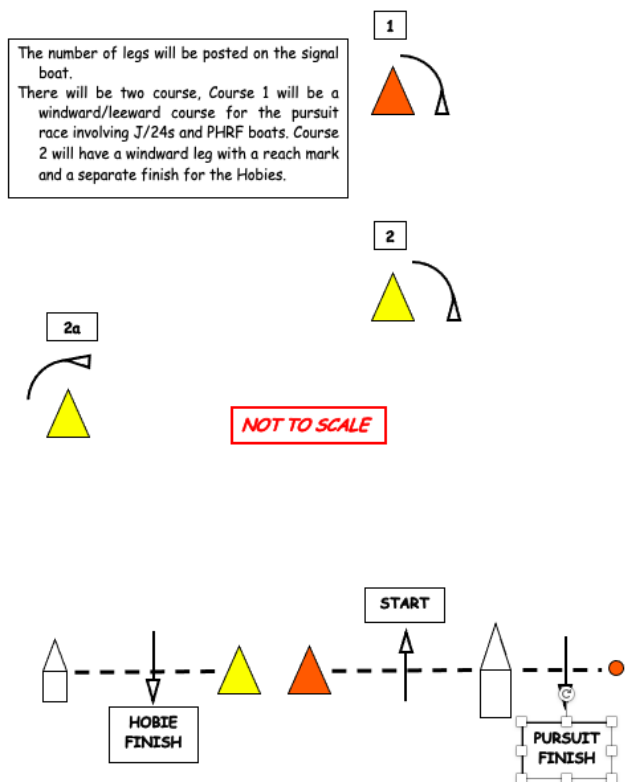

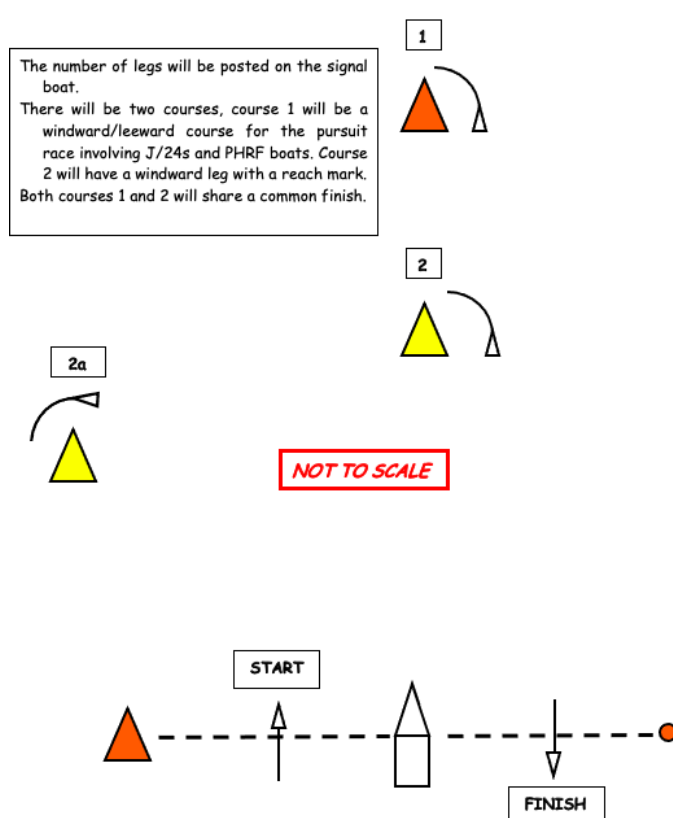
Course One Design
